ANALYTICAL

STRENGTHS:

Polite but reserved, logical, fact & task Oriented, focus on precision & perfection, persistent, diligent, cautious, take a systematic approach to everything, the analytical needs to be right and won't openly discuss ideas until confident in a decision

WEAKNESSES:
